# DOT Hazmat Training for Shippers



**DUE: EVERY 3 YEARS** 

(Every 2 years to ship by air)



## Who Needs Training?

US law requires training and regular re-training for all "hazmat employees"—this means any full time, part time, or temporary employee, or self-employed person, who "directly affects" hazmat transportation safety in their job.

[49 CFR 171.8]

## **Hazmat Training Includes:**

US DOT/PHMSA lists FIVE required elements of training for hazmat employees:

**General awareness training** to get employees familiar with DOT regulations and enable them to recognize and identify hazardous materials.

**Function-specific training** demonstrates how regulations, special permits, exceptions, etc. impact the employee's *specific* job duties.

**Security awareness training** shows the security risks of hazmat transport, methods to enhance security, and how to identify/respond to threats.

**Safety training** covers emergency response info, protection measures, and accident prevention for employees who may be exposed to hazmat.

**Security plan training** is required at facilities that *must have a Security Plan.* Employees must be trained on their role under the plan.

### When and How Often to Train



US DOT requires training...

## Within 90 days

of hire or job assignment.\*

Until trained, employees may perform regulated job functions only if directly supervised by someone who is trained.

\* For air shippers, the IATA *DGR* requires *immediate* training for hazmat employees.



Employees must complete re-training or "recurrent training" at least...

## Every 3 years\*

\*For air shippers, the IATA DGR requires training every 24 months.



## **Records of Training**

A record of training dating back 3 years must be kept for as long as the "hazmat employee" works for the employer, and for 90 days thereafter.

#### Training records must include:

- Employee's name
- Date of most recent training
- Description, copy, or location of materials
- Name and address of trainer
- Certification by employer
